The Charlotte Harbor Conference and Event Center in Punta Gorda will be the location for our 51st Annual Convention & Trade Show, September 22nd through September 25th. The Annual Exhibition

WORKSHOPS

We have four exciting workshops scheduled for you to select from this year. Mark Mehaffey, our judge and juror, will be doing a four-day workshop titled, "Experiment for Fun, Design for Success". Jim Beech, also a Signature Member of FWS, will do a one-day workshop titled "The Importance of Detail" where he will demonstrate how to really pay attention to the small, but very important details to make your painting more believable. His workshop is Thursday, September 22nd. I think we have something for everyone!



I hope you have been tuning in to our Third Thursday Demos done by these workshop artists to get a taste of what to expect in their workshops. PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGES FOR 2022

FWS President Bev Yankwitt appointed a Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee at the January 2022 Board meeting to review the status of Board actions since the last update in early 2019. Several revisions that require a membership vote to ratify are summarized below. Additional revisions are proposed for scriveners' error or correction of a non-substantive nature. Click here to review a full mark-up of proposed bylaw changes. Please watch your email for our survey vote and let your voice be heard.

MEMBERSHIP VOTE REQUIRED FOR RATIFICATION

- 1. Definition of Watercolor Article I: Name and Purpose. E. Definition. Revises the description to be consistent with the current Prospectus; affirms that changes are to be determined by the Board of Directors periodically, and members are informed of the current Prospectus annually.
- 2. Associate Members eligibility Article II: Membership. A. Categories: Associate Membership
 - a. Eliminates Exhibitions Director as a position for possible Associate Members' nomination and adds the position to Presidency and any Vice President for positions that require a Participating or Signature status.
 1. Associate Membership, c.
 - b. Allows for Board of Directors unanimous approval of Life Membership for members who distinguish themselves by way of their service on special projects. 4. Life Membership, a.
- 3. Participating/Signature Status Article II: Membership, A. Categories: 2. Participating Membership and 3. Signature Membership. An additional single-point, one-time only credit may be applied towards Signature Status for those who win an award in the Online Non-Signature Show.
- 4. Standing Committee Director positions Article III: Organizational and Bylaws, B. Officers and Directors, 1. Positions, I, 2. Election, Appointment and Terms of Office, a.; Article V: Miscellaneous Rules and Procedures. E. Election of Officers and Directors, 1. Revisions noted below are proposed consistent with the realignment of positions ratified in 2021.
 - a. Revise the Communications Director position to be a Standing Committee Director appointed by the President rather than an elected officer, subject to Board of Directors' approval.
 - b. Eliminate Publicity/Social Media Director as a standalone director position in favor of a responsibility that is assigned by the President at the beginning of each year.
- 5. Board of Directors' Voting Article III: Organizational and Bylaws, D. Board of Directors, 2. Authority, Duties and Responsibilities, c. Removes references to voting by telephone and mail in favor of electronic or email means; and puts the decision as to the need for 'virtual' decisions with the Board's discretion, rather than stipulation of 'only in emergencies'.
- 6. Past President Term Article III: Organizational and Bylaws, B. Officers and Directors, 1. Positions, h.; D. Board of Directors, 1. Composition and 3. Interim Directors. Revise commitment of Past Presidents from four to three years.
- 7. Succession Plan Article III: Organizational and Bylaws, C. Duties, 5. Third Vice President. Delete Task a. that identifies succession to Third President in absence of President and First and Second Vice President. Succession will proceed from Second Vice President to Secretary in the event the President, First and Second Vice President are not available.

Success & Opportunity

Hello Artists!

During this time of year, my social media feeds fill with artist friends celebrating acceptance into various state, regional, national, and international shows. Although I do feel a little bit of missing out when I realize I've missed opportunities, I get so excited when nice and generous people succeed!

Florida Watercolor Society is one of the most competitive state shows to get into. Every year I am stunned at the talent in the Annual Exhibition. But, there are always a few entries that surprise me; every judge and juror has a different perspective!

FWS (like many organizations) allows two paintings to be submitted for the Annual Exhibition, although only one may be selected. Typically, I have one painting that I know I want to submit and choose another as a "just because I can" entry. So far this year, my back-up painting has been the one chosen each time. Any artist will tell you that a painting can be rejected for one show and then win a major award in the next one.

As you prepare your entries, READ THE PROSPECTUS very carefully. Double-check the date you did the painting. I have a terrible memory in this regard. Fortunately, I photograph each painting with my phone as I finish it, so I can check the date of that photo to confirm the date of completion later. These are not my entry photos, but just for social media and/or my records.

My record-keeping isn't on par with Frank Spino or even Robin Lee Makowski, but when I decide to enter a show. I enter the notification date in my calendar. Until that date, I don't show that painting for sale locally, offer it for sale on my website, or enter it anywhere else physically or virtually. The last thing I want is to have it accepted and have to withdraw it, incurring a reprimand and a two-year suspension! If a painting gets into a show, I immediately put all those dates into my calendar. I go so far as to put "frame painting" and "make sure you have a shipping box" the month prior to the date it must arrive. If I am working with a framer, I always give them a "no later than date" with a little bit of a cushion. Recently, the moulding I chose did not come in when expected. Because of that cushion, four days didn't put me into a complete panic.

Perhaps your entries for our 51st Annual Exhibition have already been done. If not, the deadline is June 7th! It is exciting to see the entries roll in. Mark Mehaffey will have wonderfully hard choices to make. I am very excited to gather in person in Punta Gorda this fall. I hope to see your painting on the wall of the Visual Arts Center in Punta Gorda and in the highly anticipated Exhibition Review!

As racecar driver Bobby Unser said, "Success is where preparation and opportunity meet." Prepare now and celebrate your success in September!
